



Grow Labette and Live Healthy Montgomery County are

implementing policies that promote healthy eating and increase food access to food with local retailers, hospitals and food pantries. Our work with the *Pathways* grant will also help us increase access to walking trails and community gardens in both counties.

Community Perception

- 210 Montgomery County community members were surveyed. When asked if our community has enough options for healthy eating, over half (54%) of survey respondents disagreed or strongly disagreed.
- When survey respondents were asked what additional resources would allow them to consume healthier foods, the top responses were healthier restaurants. farmers markets, lower costs, and community gardens.
- In focus groups, members of the Labette County community garden said they want the community garden to focus on children and low-income population to increase access to healthy foods.

Healthy Eating

The **Crosstimbers Food Pantry** received a *Pathways* grant to support their work to provide healthier food to the clients they serve. Grant funds were used to purchase a variety of new items such as shelving, shopping baskets, and scales, and invested in a partnership to purchase local, fresh eggs.

Active Living



The **City of Independence** was awarded funding by *Pathways* and other organizations to improve safety by providing lighting for a new

centrally located walking trail. This trail will also provide improved access for citizens with limited mobility and enhance this community gathering space.




Commercial Tobacco Control

Labette & Montgomery Counties

The Landbank project in downtown Caney will offer a commercial tobacco free gathering space for the citizens and visitors of Caney. Community members will have the opportunity to host an event or simply sit on a bench and enjoy a beautiful day in downtown Caney.

Initiative Wide: In general, my community has sufficient options for healthy eating.



Key findings:

Nearly one-in-three respondents across the 24 *Pathways* communities said their community does not have sufficient options for healthy eating.

Results are based on data from an initative-wide survey of Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas members for whom e-mail addresses were available in each of the 26 counties in which BCBSKS has funded coalitions as part of the *Pathways to a Healthy Kansas Initiative*. N = 3,708. The survey response rate was 5.3 percent. For this question, 3.2 percent of respondents did not provide an answer (blank response).
