How to file claims?

Medicare covered services, refractions, and all diagnostic services, should be filed to BCBSKS. Non-Kansas providers file to their local plan. In-network providers are those that are MAPPO with their local plan.

Routine hardware and exam claims for EyeMed network providers should be filed to EyeMed. The member may file a claim for reimbursement for eyewear from non-EyeMed providers.
