Community Well-being Progress

The Hoisington City Council adopted HfLC's "Complete Streets" policy for better walking and biking. *Pathways* funds are assisting with installation of sidewalks and enhanced crosswalks, including three crosswalks across Highway 4 to address long-term safety concerns. The coalition was instrumental in the GPS Kids Club giving new life to a community garden, educating young people with healthy habits for the future.

Health for Life Coalition Hoisington and Northern Barton County

The Health for Life Coalition (HfLC) for Hoisington and Northern Barton County CLARA BARTON Hospital

teamed up with *Pathways* in July of 2016 to change the community's attitude and landscape of wellness. The partnership has established strong community involvement and is resulting in many healthy environmental and policy changes to help all employees, students, patrons and community members live longer and better-quality lives.

Pathways funding helped HfLC sponsor a healthy foods education program featuring wholesomecooking expert Chef Alli conducting four live classes and eight online classes. Three area restaurants signed the "Start Kids off Right" pledge to offer healthier menu strategies for kids. And Pathways funding helped all of the schools in USD 431 Hoisington and USD 112 Central Plains to install water-bottle filling stations.



HfLC and Pathways helped to complete a concrete walking path around Clara Barton Hospital, which also included outdoor fitness equipment to further encourage healthy activity. "Providers Guide It/ Walkers Stride It" is a once-a-month walking program at Clara Barton Hospital. In addition to the walk, health care providers share insights on health and wellness topics. The City of Claflin adopted a "No Smoking" policy for city buildings covering all tobacco and nicotine products, including e-cigarettes. Similarly, three area restaurants have signed the "Breathe Easy" pledge for tobacco-free policies covering the same products. And the All-Stars educational program at schools in Hoisington, Claflin and Wilson will discourage use of tobacco (smoked and smokeless) as well as alcohol, marijuana and inhalants.
